CDI-W A 1 Competitions 1-4

- Foreign athlete will be invited through their home NF.
- Invited NFs (per NF two athletes permitted): Denmark (DEN), Great Britain (GBR), Finland (FIN), Netherlands (NED), Sweden (SWE), Switzerland (SUI), Polen(POL), Portugal (POR) and in addition United States of America (USA) and Australia (AUS).
- Each NF may decide which two athletes it wishes to send to the event.
- The first 10 athletes from the FEI World Cup Standing list.
- They are included in the number of 2 per country. If more than 2 athletes from any particular country are amongst the top 10, they will all be invited.
- Up to 5 German athletes who are nominated by the federal trainer dressage.
- 1 athlete who is nominated by the FEI.
- Up to 2 German athletes (Organisers Wild cards) who are invited by the organizer

- In addition for comp. No 1 and 2 athletes holding performance rating D1+2 and being a permanent member of RV d.LV SH and HH and who at the "Landesturnier" have been placed 1st to 9th on the 2nd rating of the small tour (seniors).
- The OC reserves the right to give permission to additional athletes up to 20 competitors total to start in comp. 1 and 2

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting athletes („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

- 2.2. The 2 most successful German athletes acc. to the Rolex Ranking list No 106 holding performance rating S 1 who are a member of the TRH and who do not belong to 1.1 or 2.1.

The 2 German athletes holding performance rating S 1, who are a permanent member of a riding club belonging to the federal associations of Hamburg or Schleswig-Holstein and who have qualified on the weekend 7th February 2010 in the jumping competition of the "Verbandes der Züchter des Holsteiner Pferdes" in the "Holstenhallen", who do not belong to point 2.1 and/or 2.2 of this schedule.

B) GROOMS

Accommodation is desired the OC has to be informed accordingly, however other accommodation has to be paid by the athlete.

OCs will provide sufficient sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water for male and female grooms.

Grooms of horses participating in the CSI 3*/CDI-W will receive free meal vouchers from the organiser (breakfast and lunch from 18th – 21st February, 2010). Travelling expenses of the grooms are not covered. Per athlete one groom!

C) HORSES

If horses arrive at Neumünster and the costs have not been prepaid, the amount will not be advanced. Luggage transportation, veterinary fees or costs for the farrier must be paid by the horse owners or Athletes.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every Athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Regulations 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

3. VETERINARY ASPECTS "A"

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 11th Edition, effective 1st January 2009

~~VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS~~

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23rd edition, effective January 2009:

~~Art. 137.1~~

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 139.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

~~Art. 137.2~~

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

~~EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET REGS ANNEX VI~~

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

From 1 January 2005 onwards, influenza vaccination for all horses competing in FEI competitions requires a vaccination within six months + 21 days of the competition.

1. All horses intending to participate in FEI competition must have at least received an initial primary course of two vaccinations, given between 21 and 92 days apart. Thereafter, a third dose (referred to as the first booster) must be given within 6 months + 21 days after the date of administration of the second primary dose, with at least annual boosters given subsequently (i.e. within one year of the last dose).

2. If the horse is scheduled to take part in an FEI competition, the last booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days of arrival at the FEI event. (The 21-day window has been provided to enable vaccination requirements to fit in with the competition schedule).

3. No vaccination shall be given within 7 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

4. All horses that were certified as correctly vaccinated under the previous FEI equine influenza vaccination rule prior to 1st January 2005, do not need to start a primary course again provided that they have complied with the previous rule of primary course and annual re-vaccinations and the new rule of a booster vaccination within 6 months + 21 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CSIs/CDI (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

X. MISCELLANEOUS

By handing in the entry, owners and athletes submit themselves to the schedule, the relevant regulations of the show and the directives of the show director. Furthermore, from the time the athletes enter the show grounds they are obliged to adhere to the regulations of the German law for animal protection. In case of infringements the respective person will be suspended from the event and he will lose any rights of free hotel accommodation and similar privileges.

1) PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2) GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITIONS and PRIZE - CLASSIFICATION

CSI: Special prize to the most successful male and female foreign jumping athlete and to the most successful male and female German jumping athlete.

Point rating: this is to notify by the time schedule

3) PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

CDI-W

The placed athletes of the dressage competitions and their horses are obliged to take part in the prize giving ceremonies scheduled in the time table including the laps of honour and handing over of prizes and possibly to show fragments of the test or to present the horses on command during the main shows. In case this rule is not adhered to the athletes will lose their right to the prize money and/or prizes of honour, which they have won in the respective competition.

CSI 3*

The owner of the winning horse/pony is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix.

The athletes placed 1st to 6th in the jumping competitions are obliged to take part in the prizegiving ceremonies scheduled in the time table including the laps of honour and handing over of prizes. In case this rule is not adhered to the athletes may lose their right to the prize money and/or prizes of honour, which they have won in the respective competition.

4) DISTRIBUTION of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art.127,128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per Athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each Athlete binds himself, to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the Athlete. Acc. to § 50a this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR; more than 250 EUR: 15 % tax; plus 5,5 % solidarity fee of the income tax. The tax deduction has to be confirmed on demand. Those foreign athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

5) INSURANCES

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

6) LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

7) EVENT'S ORGANISATION

Acc. to Art. 110.1 and 2 RG the OC reserves the right

- a) to modify the schedule in agreement with the NF GER and the FEI
- b) either to postpone the event or to cancel the event, in this case entry fees have to be returned.

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping or Dressage Department by the Foreign Judge.

8) SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These athletes will start first in these competitions.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
